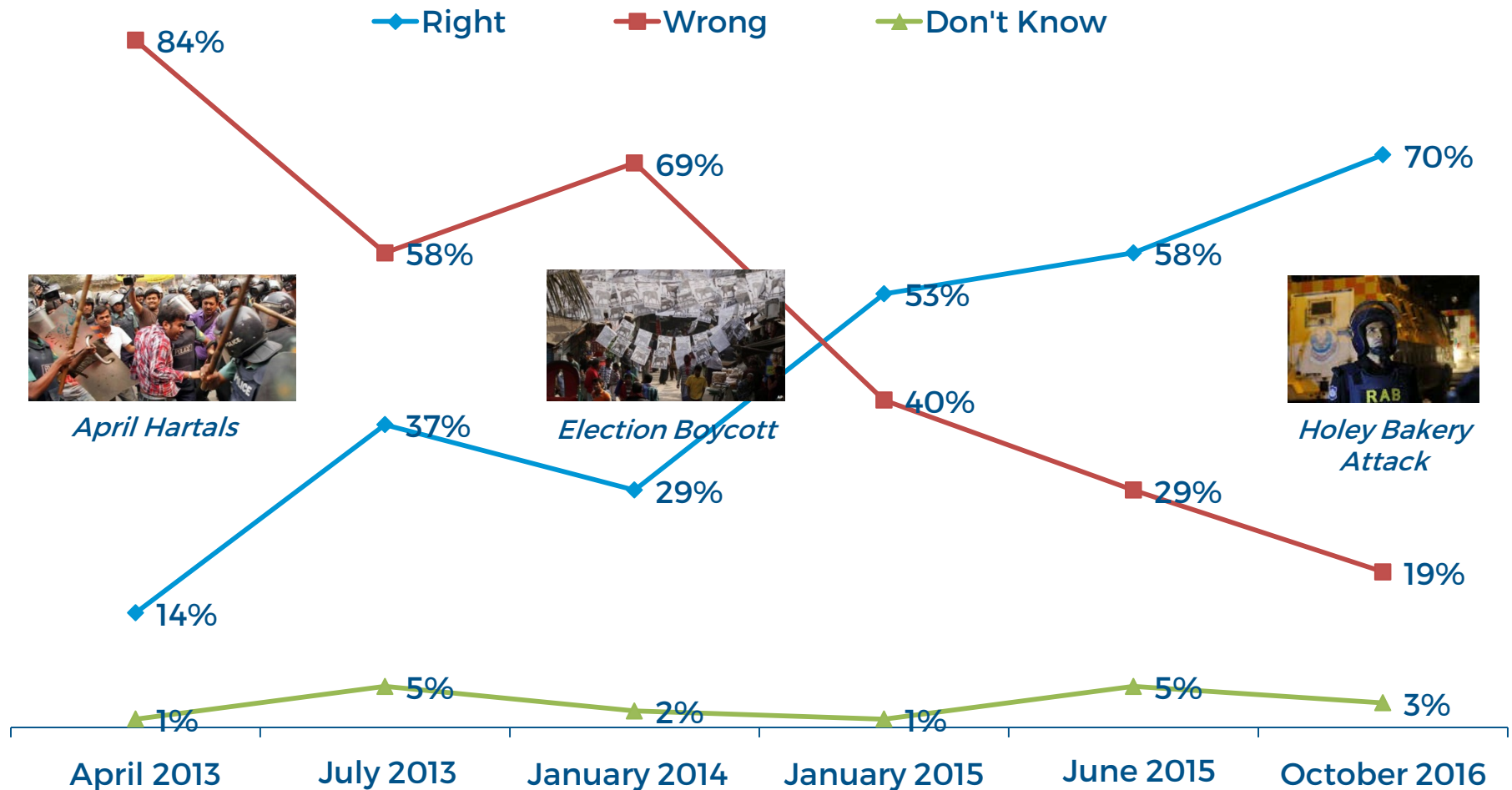

# Methodology

- Democracy International conducted a national survey of n=1453 Bangladeshis of voting age using DI's in-house Computer Assisted Telephone Survey System (CATSS).
- The margin of error is  $\pm 2.6\%$  at the 95% confidence level.
- Interviews were conducted between October 23 and October 31, 2016.

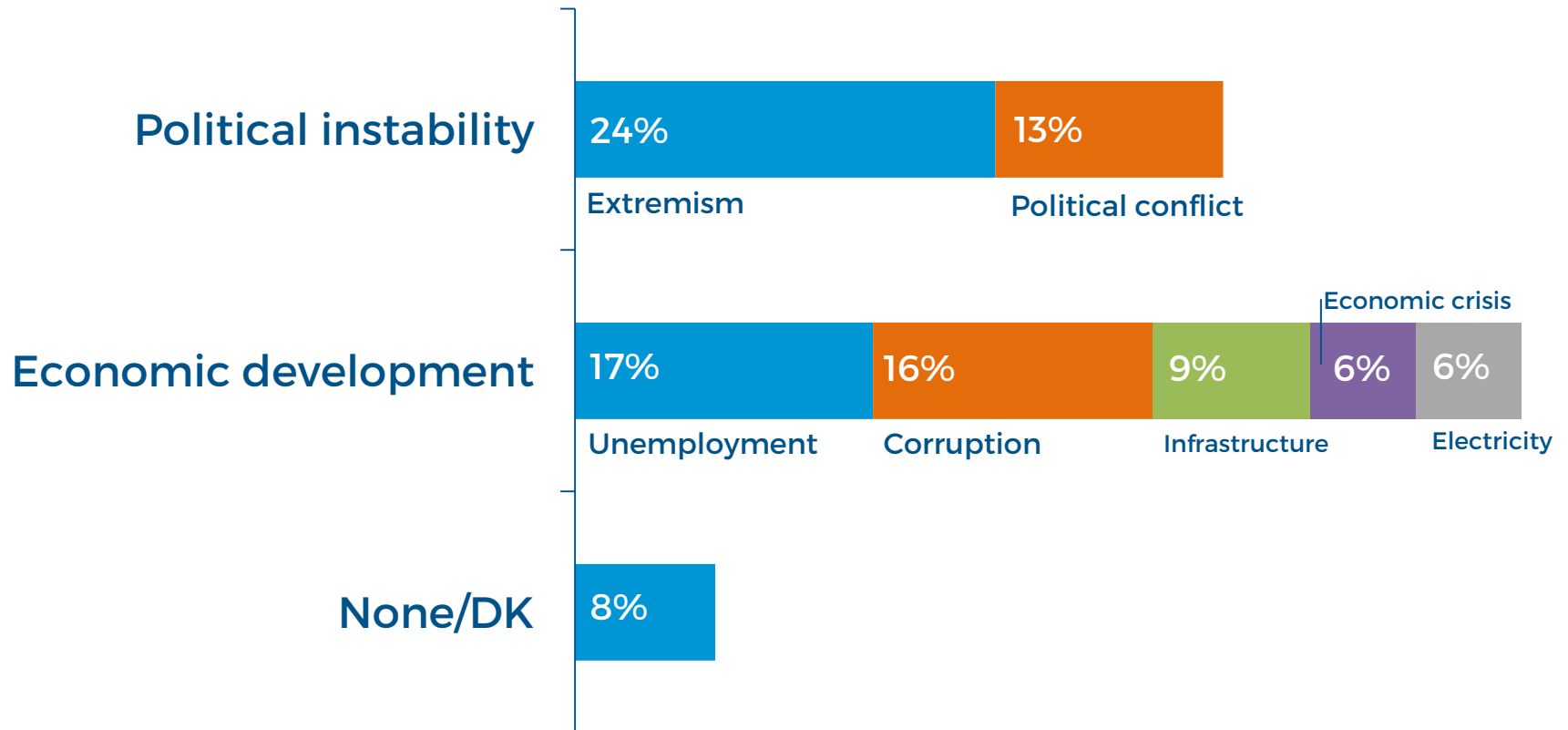
# 70% think that Bangladesh is heading in the right direction.

Q: Do you think things in Bangladesh are headed in the right direction or are they headed in the wrong direction?



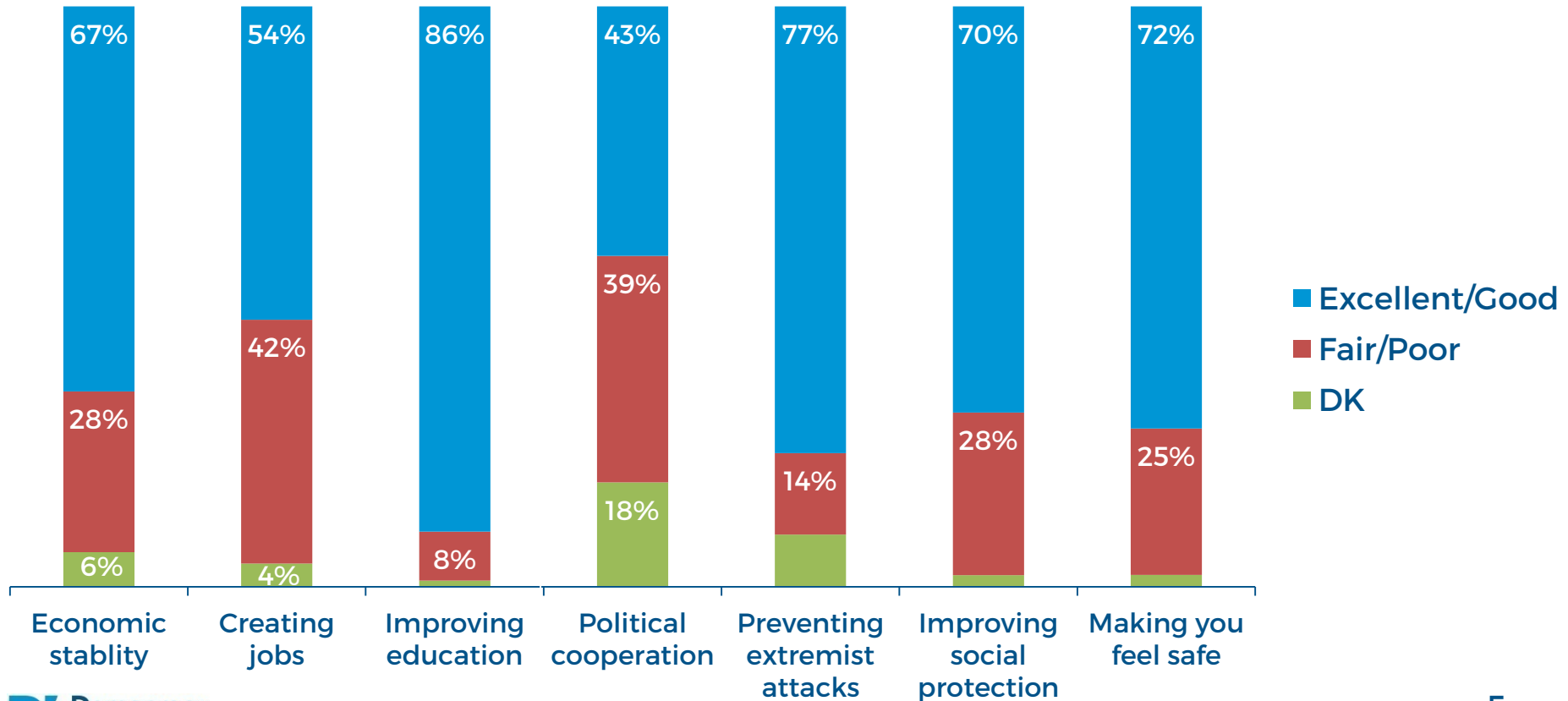
# Greatest problem facing Bangladesh

Q: I'm going to read you a list of problems facing Bangladesh. Please tell me which is the single most serious problem facing the country right now.



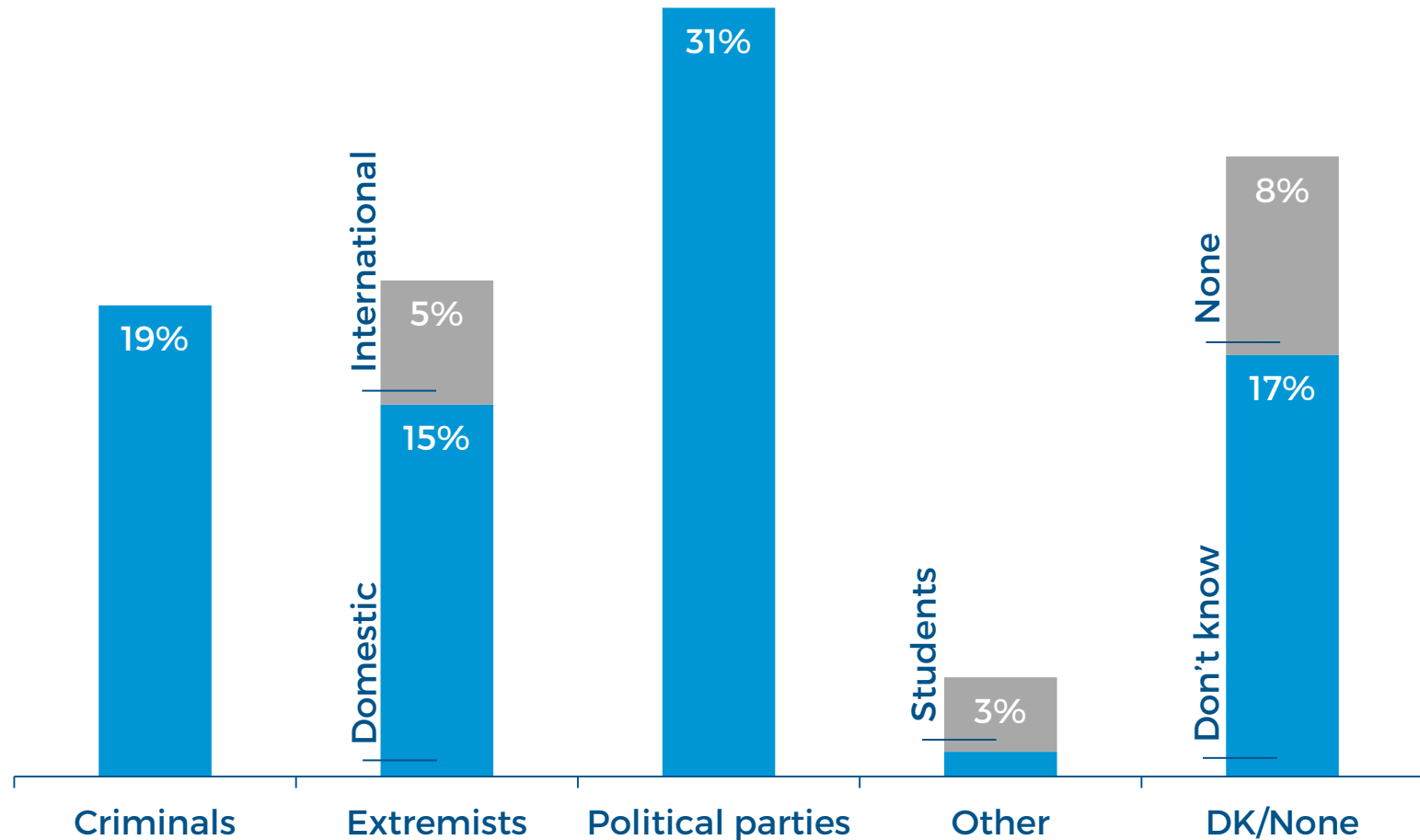
# 77% of respondents think government is doing an excellent or good job in preventing extremist attacks.

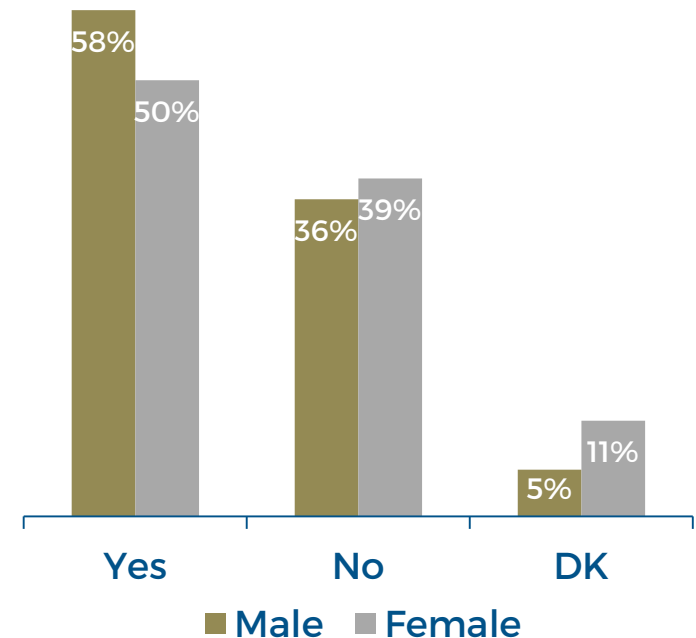
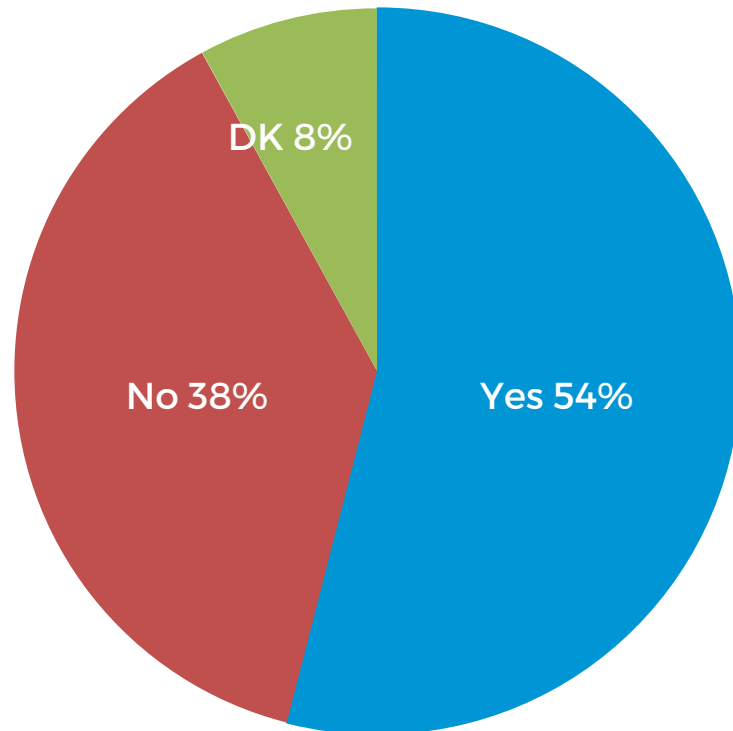
# Respondents identify political parties as most responsible for current violence in the country.

Q: I'm going to read you a list of groups. Please tell me which one is the single most responsible for current violence in the country.



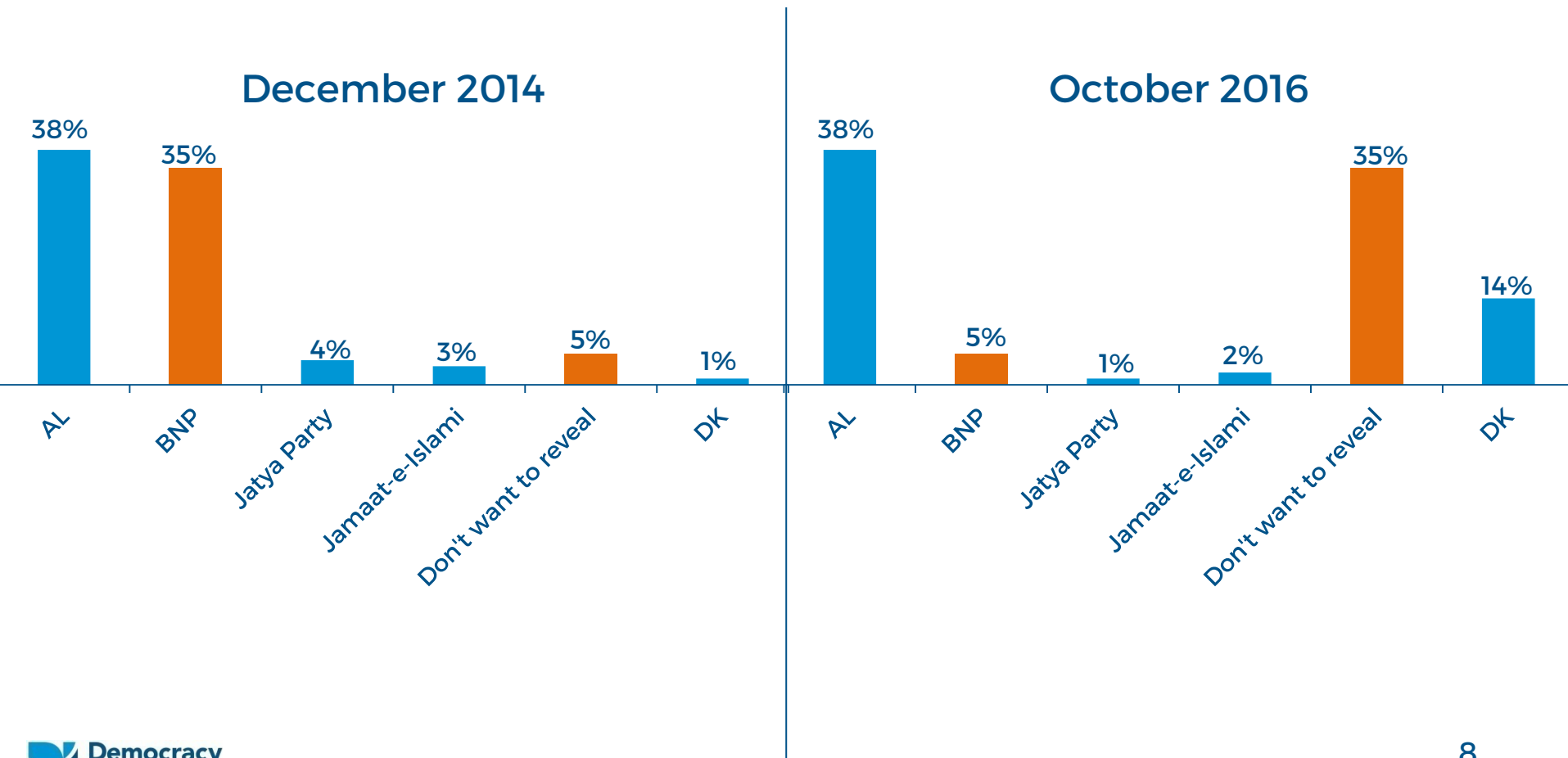
# 54% of respondents think people feel free to express their political opinions.

Q: Do most people in the area where you live feel free to express their political opinions?



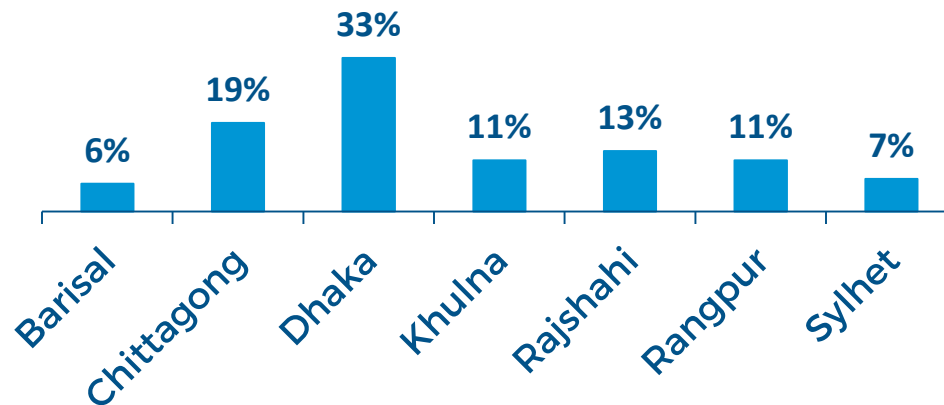
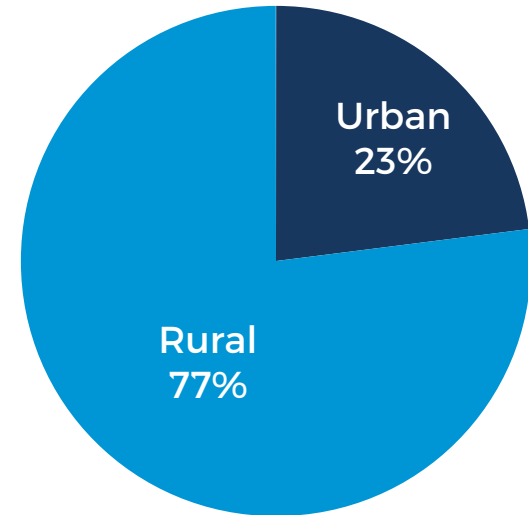
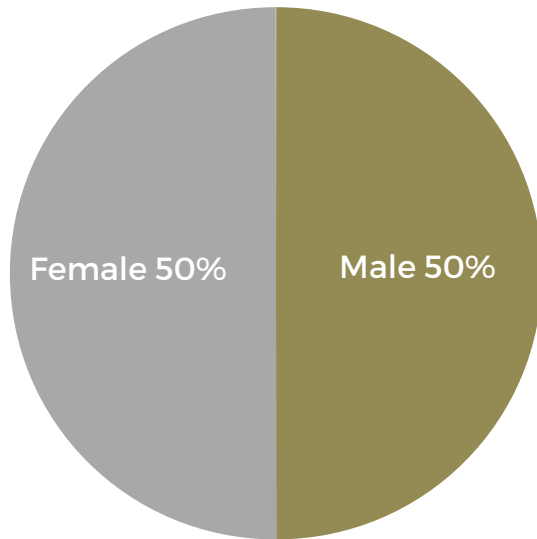
# 5% of respondents say they would vote for the BNP while 35% don't want to reveal who they would vote for.

Q: If the national elections were held today, for which party would you likely vote?



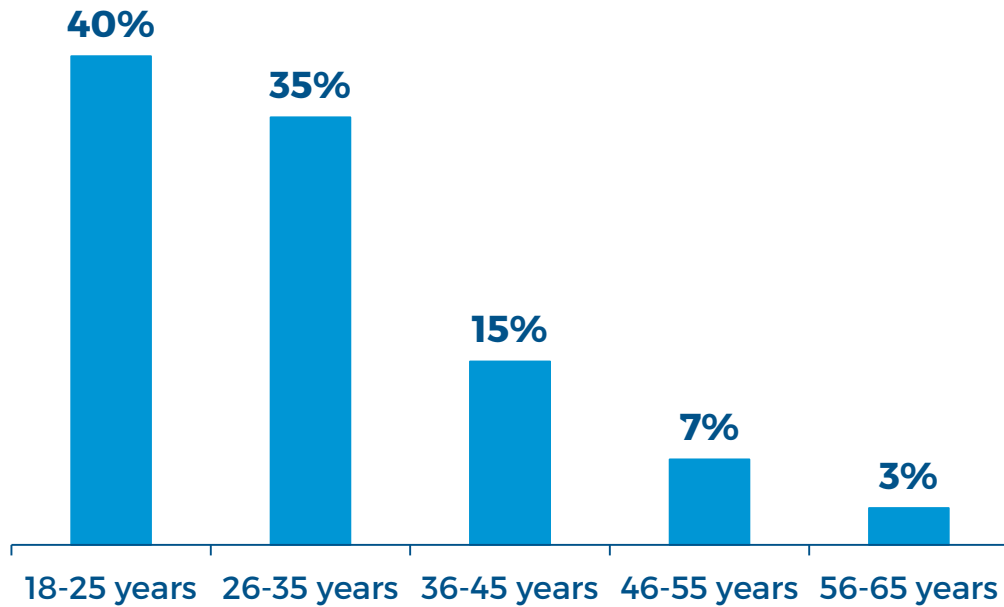
